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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • REDCap affordable for non-profit (\$118/mo); Ona Data (no IOS platform – cost more and through a third party) \$2400/yr. • Can collect surveys on-line, can enter hard copy surveys via the web, can design surveys, mobile apps, compatible with IOS and android, HIPAA compliant • Usability, well established, active partners, flexibility but KMNH would need to submit an application for a license to be approved in order to use the software. • Data Committee did meet and review the research from KMNH, PIC uses Survey 1,2,3. • Desires a vote now so can move forward as implementing will take some time <p>2. HMIS Access Policy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Getting interests from several organizations to have access to BTG HMIS. Due to previous issue and lack of knowledge of the system, KMNH feels we need to create a better guideline before they granting access. Most organizations don't understand the basic concepts or mistakenly think PIC and BTG run the same. There could possibly be a flow chart, information. We do not have a policy in place now for this and feel this will give basic knowledge and understanding before requesting access. Will continue to work on this with the data committee. <p>Sharon asked if there would be training for organizations or local chapters to take on? Alison stated that still working on this and working with the data committees.</p> <p>Harold: resources that would be available to support any training, other resources that might be available to support this training. What is it going to take to train and build capacity?</p>	<p>Paul is asking for Brandee to have a vote. Brandee is part of the data committee and participated in this discussion.</p> <p>Vote: Three abstentions, 6 ayes</p>

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 6.9 million, (7% for HPO admin, 1% for HMIS) adding in outreach services (up to 2 years) to identify households affected and impacted by wildfires, utilize funds • Kauai 1 staff and one vehicle • Hawaii 1 staff and one vehicle • Maui two staff and two vehicles • Contracted with KMNH and CCH to administer the rental assistance program. • Rapid re-housing, project based rapid re-housing because there is currently a low housing inventory and expensive driven up rental costs (some of the housing coming up in the near future) • Homeless prevention and rapid-rehousing and project based rapid re-housing will be part of this funding • May 8 notice for a public hearing regarding the 2nd allocation of funds <p>Sharon asking about data and numbers of families that have been relocated to a neighbor island Harold stating that he does not have that data Melody stating that there are people on Kauai, just had a second person come by. Not sure about the verification of homelessness and if this was going to be expanded, sent to KEO but wasn't able to access services Harold – looking at broadening the scope of homeless verification (previously homeless and in the affected area). There were 400+ people reported by ARC, data quality from ARC and FEMA difficult and hard to decipher. Want to extend to the broadest extent possible.</p>
